May 27— Holy Trinity/Pentecost I—John 3:17

July 11—Pentecost VII—Mark 6:14-29

Some were saying, “John the baptizer has been raised from the dead; and for this reason these powers are at work in him.”

July 18—Pentecost VIII—Mark 6:30-34, 53-56

When they got out of the boat, people at once recognized him, and rushed about that whole region and began to bring the sick on mats to wherever they heard he was

July 25—Pentecost IX—John 6:1-21

“There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish. But what are they among so many people?”

August 1—Pentecost X—John 6:24-35

Do not work for the food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you.

August 6— Transfiguration of Our Lord—Luke 9:35

This is my Son, my Chosen; Listen to Him!

August 8—Pentecost XI—John 6:35, 41-51

Simon Peter answered him, “Lord, to whom can we go? You have the words of eternal life...”

August 29---Pentecost XIV—Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23
