June 30—Pentecost III—Luke 9:62

Follow me. No one who puts a hand to the plow and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God.

July 7—Pentecost IV—Luke 10:20

Do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven.

July 14—Pentecost V—Luke 10:36^f.

Who was neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?—the one who showed mercy—Go and do likewise.

July 21—Pentecost VI—Luke 10:39, 42

Mary, who listened to what the Lord was saying, has chosen the better part, which will not be taken from her.

July 28—Pentecost VII—Luke 11:13

If you, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!

August 4—Pentecost VIII—Luke 12:15, 21

Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions...So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are rich toward God.

August 6— Transfiguration of Our Lord—Luke 9:35

This is my Son, my Chosen; Listen to Him!

August 11—Pentecost IX—Luke 12:32

Do not be afraid, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom.

August 15—St. Mary, Mother of Our Lord—Luke 1:46^f

My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my savior.

August 18—Pentecost X—Luke 12:50

I have a baptism with which to be baptized, and what stress I am under until it is completed!

August 25—Pentecost XI—Luke 13:16

Ought not this woman, whom Satan bound eighteen years, be set free from this bondage on the Sabbath day?

September 1—Pentecost XII—Luke 14:11

For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted.

September 8—Pentecost XIII—Luke 14:27

Whoever does not carry the cross and follow me cannot be my disciple.

September 14—Holy Cross Day—John 3:14^f

Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

September 15—Pentecost XIV—Luke 15:10

There is joy in the presence of God over one sinner who repents.

September 22—Pentecost XV—Luke 16:13

No one can serve two masters; for a slave will either hate the one and love the other, or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth.

September 29—Pentecost XVI—Luke 16:31

If they do not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be convinced even if someone rises from the dead.

September 30 (*Transferred*)—St. Michael & All Angels—Luke 10:20

Do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven.

October 6—Pentecost XVII—Luke 17:10

When you have done all that you were ordered to do, say, “We are worthless slaves; we have done only what we ought to have done.”

October 13—Pentecost XVIII—Luke 17:19

Get up and go on your way; your faith has made you well.

October 20—Pentecost XIX—Luke 18:7^f

Will not God grant justice to his chosen ones who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long in helping them? I tell you, he will quickly grant justice to them.

October 27—Pentecost XX—Luke 18:14

This man went down to his home justified rather than the other; for all who exalt themselves will be humbled, but all who humble themselves will be exalted.

October 31—Reformation Day—John 8:36

If the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed.

November 1—All Saints Day—Luke 6:23

Rejoice in that day and leap for joy, for surely your reward is great in heaven.

November 3—Pentecost XXI—Luke 19:10

The Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost.

November 10—Pentecost XXII—Luke 20:38

Now the Lord is god not of the dead, but the living.

November 17—Pentecost XXIII—Luke 21:19

By your endurance, you will gain your souls.

November 24—Christ the King—Luke 23:42^f

Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.—Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise.
