October 28—Pentecost XXII—2 Timothy 4:18

The Lord will rescue me from every evil attack and save me for his heavenly kingdom. To him be the glory forever and ever.

October 31—Reformation Day—Romans 3:22-25

For there is no distinction, since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ, whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith.

November 1—All Saints Day—Ephesians 1:17ff.

I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power.

November 4—Pentecost XXIII—2 Thessalonians 1:11f.

To this end we always pray for you, asking that our God will make you worthy of his call and will fulfill by his power every good resolve and work of faith, so that the name of our Lord Jesus may be glorified in you, and you in him, according to the grace of our God and the Lord Jesus Christ.

November 11—Pentecost XXIV—2 Thessalonians 2:15

So then, stand firm and hold fast to the traditions that you were taught by us, either by word of mouth or by our letter.

November 18—Pentecost XXV—2 Thessalonians 3:6

Now we command you, beloved, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, to keep away from believers who are living in idleness and not according to the tradition that they received from us.

November 25—Christ the King—Colossians 1:19f.

In his beloved Son all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his Cross.

May 26—Vigil of Pentecost—Romans 8:27

God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.

May 27—Day of Pentecost—Romans 8:15ff.

When we cry, “Abba! Father!” it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ—if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

June 3—Holy Trinity—Romans 5:1f.

Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God.

June 10—Pentecost II—Galatians 1:11f.

I want you to know that the Gospel that was proclaimed by me is not of man; for I did not receive it from man, nor was I taught it, but I received it through a revelation of Jesus Christ.

June 17—Pentecost III—Galatians 2:19f.

I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but it is Christ who lives in me.

June 24—Pentecost IV—Galatians 3:27

As many of you as were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is no longer Jew or Greek, slave or free, male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus.

July 1—Pentecost V—Galatians 5:24

Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit.

July 8—Pentecost VI—Galatians 6:14

May I never boast of anything except the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world.

July 15—Pentecost VII—Colossians 1:13f.

The Father has rescued us from the power of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

July 22—Pentecost VIII—Colossians 1:28

It is Christ whom we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone in all wisdom, so that we may present everyone mature in Christ.

July 29—Pentecost IX—Colossians 2:12

When you were buried with Christ in Baptism, you were also raised with him through faith in the power of God, who raised him from the dead.

August 5—Pentecost X—Colossians 3:1

So if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God.

August 6—Transfiguration of Our Lord—2 Corinthians 3:18

All of us, with unveiled faces, seeing the glory of the Lord as though reflected in a mirror, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another; for this comes from the Lord, the Spirit.

August 12—Pentecost XI—Hebrews 11:1

Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen.

August 15—Virgin Mary, Mother of Our Lord—Galatians 4:4f.

When the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, in order to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as children.

August 19—Pentecost XII—Hebrews 12:1f.

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith.

August 26—Pentecost XIII—Hebrews 12:28

Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be

shaken, let us give thanks, by which we offer to God an acceptable worship with reverence and awe.

September 2—Pentecost XIV—Hebrews 13:15

Through Jesus Christ let us continually offer a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that confess his name.

September 9—Pentecost XV—Philemon 6

I pray that the sharing of your faith may become effective when you perceive all the good that we may do for Christ.

September 14—Holy Cross Day—1 Corinthians 1:18

The message about the Cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

September 16—Pentecost XVI—1 Timothy 1:15

The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners—of whom I am the foremost.

September 23—Pentecost XVII—1 Timothy 2:5f.

There is one God; there is also one mediator between God and mankind, Christ Jesus, himself man, who gave himself a ransom for all—this was attested at the right time.

September 30—Pentecost XVIII—1 Timothy 6:15f.

God alone, who is the blessed and only Sovereign, the King of kings and Lord of lords, has immortality and dwells in unapproachable light, whom no one has ever seen or can see; to him be honor and eternal dominion.

October 7—Pentecost XIX—2 Timothy 1:9f.

The grace given to us in Christ Jesus before the ages began has now been revealed through the appearing of our Savior Christ Jesus, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the Gospel.

October 14—Pentecost XX—2 Timothy 2:11ff.

If we have died with Christ Jesus, we will also live with him; if we endure, we will also reign with him; if we deny him, he will also deny us; if we are faithless, he remains faithful—for he cannot deny himself.

October 21—Pentecost XXI—2 Timothy 3:16f.

All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work.
